Field Marshall and Obama weighed 2820 kgs and the winner was Mrs IJ Williams with her guess of 2823 kgs. The giant turkeys weighed 52lb 12oz and the winner was Mrs J Reeves with her guess of 52lb 10oz. A total of £1074 was raised on Show Day for the Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance.

Press Release

Wow! What a trade. Every year the South West Winter Fair just gets better and better and this year's show really stepped up to another level. You have always had to have a "good one" to win the Championship. Now you have to have a "good one" to win a class.

This year's Champion was a beautiful Limousin heifer, out of a Limousin cross Angus cow from Messrs TC Edwards & Sons (Gwyn) of Pencraig Fawr, Corwen, Ruthin, North Wales. Tip Top was so correct on her plates with a tremendous depth of fleshing throughout she was bought by the judge, Mr Stuart Clatworthy of Court Farm Butchers, Puriton. Tip Top previously won what was without doubt the best and most even class ever seen at Sedgemoor, which highlighted the depth of competition. Tip Top weighed 508kg and sold for £3,000 (590.6ppk).

Taking the top price of the day at £4,000 and the Reserve Champion slot were Mike and Mel Alford with another Limousin cross heifer, "Real Thing". This very showy black heifer, with exquisite lines weighed 512kg and achieved 781.3ppk.

Standing reserve, reserve was a pure bred Limousin steer from Mr BE Williams (Elvid and shown by Neil Lloyd) from Station Court, Brecon. This steer was reserve champion steer at the Welsh Winter Fair, pedigree champion steer at Smithfield and was also placed first in the Pedigree or Purebred continental steer or heifer, born of pedigree parentage class here at Sedgemoor. The steer weighed 597kg and sold at 254.5ppk.

Another big money heifer was an extreme Blue cross Limousin, "Pricey" from Christine Williams and Paul Tippetts. This heifer had by far the greatest spring, with massive top and silverside rounds. She sold for breeding at 449.5ppk at 611kg. Next best in the money list was Mr JEL Morgan (Eddy) of Llys Newydd of Llandovery at 255.5ppk, with a wonderfully balanced 626kg Blue cross Limousin steer, which won the open heavyweight steer class. Eddy Morgan also took second prize in the heavyweight heifer class, with a black Limousin cross which displayed real quality and width of hind quarter and sold at 324.5ppk for 625kg.

Another over 300ppk at 304.5ppk was a black Limousin heifer from Harry Porter. This stylish heifer Milly won class one after a successful Summer showing campaign.

300ppk was also bid for a home bred 512kg Blonde heifer from the same stable as the Champion, that of Gwyn Edwards, which stood second in the home bred class. Christine Williams and Paul Tippetts scored again at 279.2ppk for the home bred Champion, being a very well fleshed 573kg Charolais.

The first Welsh Black to be shown at Sedgemoor came forward from Elvid Williams. This exquisite 536kg heifer won the native class and went on to sell for 254.5ppk.

Many other haltered show cattle went on to sell in the 220ppk to 240ppk bracket.

The unaltered championship went to Daryl and Sarah Cheacker of Pilning with a superb red Limousin steer which achieved 269.5ppk, having been weighed at 587kg.
