
Boasting quirky shops, vibrant restaurants and bars, excellent nightlife an eccentric art scenes and landmarks such as the Emirates Stadium, it won't take you very long to fall in love with this charming patch of London. Highbury and Islington have some of the best-preserved Victorian architecture and Edwardian townhouses around the city. RESTAURANT

The area is always full of new places to eat, offering a wide variety of cuisines, including Addis, Meat Liquor, Drink Shop and Do, The Gate, Trullo, Prawn on the Lawn and Pho House, to name a few.





ATTRACTIONS

As with many London boroughs, each section of Islington is unique in its own right. Southgate Road is known as the "middle class" section of town. There are no high street chains, no heavy traffic (for London anyway), and no cutting corners on its attractions. It offers some relaxing gardens to visit and chill out, as well as some of the best quality cafes, pubs and restaurants in the area. If you're looking for something a bit more grounded then Caledonian Road is the place for you

It is a multicultural melting pot where residents and visitors can expect to find cheap-but-cheerful businesses selling a range of global cuisines, making it one of the more authentically London-ish parts of the surrounding area.

Caledonian road sees a lot of students, champagne socialists, immigrant communities, and honest working-class people, bringing a quirky and diverse atmosphere to the area. Those of you looking for more traditional entertainment can visit Club du Fromage, which hosts live music weekly. Otherwise, Islington has a thriving night and theatrical scene too, as you would expect from a student-popular borough.

Upper Street hosts many lively bars, which are always buzzing on the weekends, and the New Red Lion Theatre on St John Street regularly hosts shows and performances.



TRANSPORT

Highbury and Islington is easily accessible by the London Underground and Overground, being accessible on the Piccadilly, Victoria, and London Overground lines. These links provide quick access into London, as well as adjacent boroughs, which can give plenty of cover for work and pleasure.

There are also regular buses into the area, with the number 43 offering a 24 hours service down the main Islington roads and terminating at London Bridge.








SCHOOLS
