We respond to emergency appeals around the world: we have helped Dog Meat Trade Survivors in South Korea and our team flew to South America to help the dogs after the horrific floods

Education in schools: we work in primary schools across Romania and hold lessons as part of their curriculum in Animal Care.

Our Voice: we continue speaking out for the dogs, who have no voice – working with local governments

Individual dogs: we rescue dogs who have suffered extreme abuse such as having their bodies axed

Public kill shelters: we save dogs from kill shelters.

Children: At Christmas and Easter we drive from the UK tons of gifts for the orphans or children in desperate need

Prepare for Winter: with the cold in Romania below -25C, dogs die in winter. Our project every year helps small rescuers to provide kennels and food – saving lives

We support local rescuers: donating food, support and paying vet bills for thousands of rescued dogs in their care

Projects: bring water or electricity to shelters – improving living conditions for animals

Neutering: We tackle the root of the stray dog problem – we neuter. This year we have held neuter campaigns in the shanty towns in Peru as part of our global responsibility, and we currently have 4 neutering campaigns running in Romania where we will neuter any dog or cat, stray or owned. Our campaigns are more than just a vet clinic, we are in the communities, educating on neutering, animal care and their responsibility to animals. If one dog and its offspring produce 67,000 in 9 years, as statistics suggest, then this summer alone in Romania, we have prevented over 88 million stray puppies and kittens from being born – please support us so that we can keep neutering.
